Gender-based violence is experienced by a person who is:

- Threatened, insulted, humiliated or beaten
- Isolated, segregated
- Constantly followed or surveilled
- Forced not to work, denied money or belongings
- Prevented from accessing education, medical assistance, justice
- Raped or forced to perform or subjected to sexual acts of any kind (also by a partner or former partner even if non-cohabiting)
- Sexually harassed at work
- Forced into prostitution
- Forced into marriage
- Forced to terminate a pregnancy or abandon children
- Forced to beg or work without pay
- Subjected to female genital mutilation
- Offended and/or threatened through the dissemination of private photos or videos of a sexual nature without consent
- Mistreated for being lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex, queer, etc.

If you are experiencing, have experienced or fear you might soon find yourself experiencing violence, you can:

- **▼ Receive information** about your rights
- Receive accommodation in a safe house, if you fear for your safety
- Receive medical, psychological and legal assistance
- Ask to remain in Italy, by applying for international protection (your application will then be examined by a Territorial Commission) or another type of residence permit
- Ask to return to your country of origin in safety, through an assisted voluntary return programme
