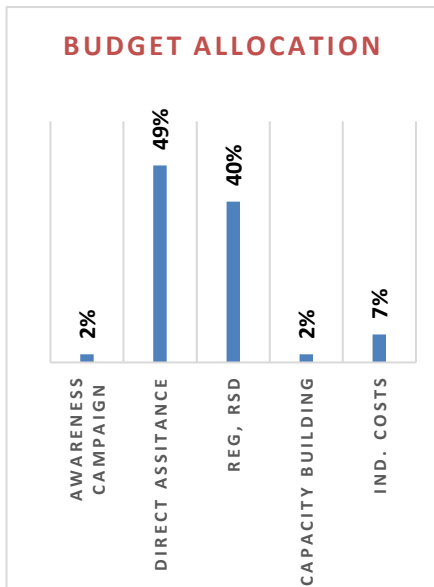
Refugees and asylum-seekers

8.982 Migrants

With the resettlement pledges received by third countries at the beginning of last two years, the situation was challenging, nevertheless, cumulatively 1.334 resettlement registration forms were submitted and 890 among the most vulnerable refugees awaiting resettlement received multi-purpose cash assistance (MPCA).

Till September 2024, the Common Feedback Mechanism (CFM) providing support and accountability on available humanitarian assistance programs, received 125.820 calls relating to resettlement inquires, opportunities or follow up on cases in process, as well as to protection needs assessments or available assistance in Libya.

To contribute to upholding safety and dignity, and to prevent and alleviate the suffering of vulnerable migrants (including victims of trafficking and children at risk) in Ejdabya, a region with varying degrees of humanitarian, health, protection, and psychosocial needs, IOM Libya has established a multi-service community center (MRRM base) and a MRRM mobile team responsible for providing a wide range of direct assistance services. 5951 migrants were provided with protection services including food and NFIs distribution, health and medical assistance, Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS), protection services and referrals to vulnerable migrants. Over 3000 migrants have been provided with information on the risks of irregular migration, regular migration pathways, and other services accessible to migrants through 231 awareness raising sessions conducted by IOM. Furthermore, the MRRM team implements community-based projects encouraging social cohesion among migrants, host communities, and other groups within the community. The project also foresees workshops and trainings for local authorities and key stakeholders on migration-related topics to build their capacity on migration governance.
