Till September 2024, 5.966 asylum-seekers were outreached by the UNHCR partner Moroccan Organisation for Human Rights (OMDH) from Eastern and Northern regions of the country (Oujda, Nador and Tangier) and referred to UNHCR in Rabat for subsequent registration and refugee status determination; 10.092 new asylum-seekers were registered; 1.120 RSD individual decisions were adjudicated; 1.009 individuals were trained by UNHCR and its partners.

IOM Morocco organized 2 National Steering Committees (Comités de pilotage du projet) with relevant local authorities and partners.

The main CSOs working on migrants' protection were identified and agreements were signed for the provision of humanitarian and legal assistance (1.713 migrants so far assisted).

In total, 79 key actors participated in training activities on migration governance and terminology, protection of vulnerable migrants, and human trafficking. Following several meetings held between IOM and the African Migration Observatory (AMO), the project activities were redefined and aligned with the AMO's current needs. The Terms of Reference (ToRs) were drawn up and shared with stakeholders for validation and for the recruitment of the expert. Key changes include producing a comprehensive report on good practices in migration governance in Africa, standardizing AU migration-related terms through a glossary for the continent, a lessons-learned roadmap, and a migration data module for surveys.
